


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Preface

SNDT Women's University is the first Women's university in India as well as in South-East Asia. The University was founded by Bharatratna Maharshi Dr. Dhondo Keshav Karve in 1916 for a noble cause of Women's Education. The first five women graduated in 1921 from this University. The University Headquarters is in Churchgate Campus, Mumbai and the other two campuses of this University are at Juhu, Mumbai and Karve Road, Pune.

In a century old existence, the university has grown into a multidisciplinary institution hosting diverse professional, technical and liberal arts programmes from K12 to PhD. SNDTWU is probably one such university where there is Nursery school as laboratory for Human Development Department, Centres for Women's Studies, Inclusion and Exclusion, Distance Education, Lifelong Education, Polytechnic and has affiliated institutions for doctoral programmes. Unlike most universities in the country which have to have state jurisdiction, SNDTWU is unique in terms of jurisdiction. SNDTWU can affiliate colleges/institutions anywhere in India with prior consent from the State Government.

SNDT Women's University, Mumbai is one of the frontrunners in adopting the novel educational trends. The National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 is a thoughtfully planned guiding document introduced to change the face of Education in India. This document enlists the action plan and goals of SNDT Women's University in implementation of the NEP 2020.

The gigantic task of preparing the Comprehensive Roadmap for Implementation of NEP by the Task Force involved a series of discussions/consultative sessions with the eminent experts from various prestigious higher educational institutes and academia of the University. The Task Force conducted brainstorming sessions with internal and external experts to devise the roadmap for implementation. The present document is an outcome of the collective discussions and efforts by the members of the task force. To achieve the Vision of the University, the NEP Task force of SNDTWU has envisaged the path for implementation of NEP 2020 and has identified nine thrust areas. The goals for each area have been devised with a clear strategy of implementation.

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Focus Areas

The NEP 2020 States that in the 21st century, quality higher education must aim to develop good, thoughtful, well-rounded, and creative individuals. It must enable an individual to study one or more specialized areas of interest at a deep level. It should also develop character, ethical and Constitutional values, intellectual curiosity, scientific temper, creativity, spirit of service. In addition, it should also help to inculcate the 21st century capabilities across a range of disciplines including sciences, social sciences, arts, humanities, languages, as well as professional, technical, and vocational subjects. A quality higher education must enable personal accomplishment and enlightenment, constructive public engagement, and productive contribution to society. Policy Goal

The NEP 2020 states that, 'a holistic and multidisciplinary education would aim to develop all capacities of human beings - intellectual, aesthetic, social, physical, emotional, and moral in an integrated manner'. The policy aims to provide an education to help develop well-rounded individuals that possess critical 21st century capacities in the fields across arts, humanities, languages, sciences, social sciences, and professional, technical, and vocational fields; an ethic of social engagement; soft skills, such as communication, discussion and debate; and rigorous specialization in a chosen field or fields. In the long term, holistic education should be the approach of all undergraduate programmes, including those in professional, technical, and vocational disciplines.

An autonomous body, the National Educational Technology Forum (NETF), will be created to provide a platform for the free exchange of ideas on the use of technology to enhance learning, assessment, planning, administration, and so on, both for school and higher education.

Rationale

Use and integration of technology to improve multiple aspects of education will be supported and adopted, provided these interventions are rigorously and transparently evaluated in relevant contexts before they are scaled up. An autonomous body, the National Educational Technology Forum (NETF), will be created to provide a platform for the free exchange of ideas on the use of technology to enhance learning, assessment, planning, administration, and so on, both for school and higher education. The aim of the NETF will be to facilitate decision making on the induction, deployment, and use of technology, by providing to the leadership of education institutions, State and Central governments, and other stakeholders, the latest knowledge and research as well as the opportunity to consult and share best practices.

Policy Goal

India will be promoted as a global study destination providing premium education at affordable costs thereby helping to restore its role as a Vishwa Guru. An International Students Office at each HEI hosting foreign students will be set up to coordinate all matters relating to welcoming and supporting students arriving from abroad. Research/teaching collaborations and faculty/student exchanges with high-quality foreign institutions will be facilitated, and relevant mutually beneficial MOUs with foreign countries will be signed. High performing Indian universities will be encouraged to set up campuses in other countries, and similarly, selected universities e.g., those from among the top 100 universities in the world will be facilitated to operate in India. Research collaboration and student exchanges between Indian institutions and global institutions will be promoted through special efforts.

Rationale

The NEP extensively focuses on attaining the highest global standards in the quality of higher education. It reinforces the need to attract a greater number of international students and achieve the goal of “internationalization at home”. NEP highlights the critical need to promote India as a “global study destination” providing premium education at affordable costs thereby helping to restore its role as “Vishwa Guru”. The policy also aims to make our young generation of learners aware and understand global issues and make them truly global citizens committed to human rights, sustainable development and global well-being.

In light of the National Education Policy (NEP), 2020 and University Grants Commission Guidelines for Internationalization of Higher Education, SNTD WU also aims to undertake and initiate Internationalization initiatives.

Focus Area 6: Promotion of Indian Languages, Art & Culture

Policy Goal

The NEP 2020 envisions the important role of indigenous culture, art and Indian languages in higher education. UNESCO has declared 197 Indian languages as 'endangered'. Teaching and learning of Indian Languages need to be integrated with higher education at every level. It is this reasoning and urgency that we need to implement this focal area of NEP 2020 at our University.

Policy Goal

Rationale

An effective learning environment should include an appropriate curriculum, engaging pedagogy, continuous formative assessment, and sufficient student support. These conditions are required for students to succeed in their studies. An updated curriculum that is in line with current knowledge and specific learning outcomes aids in students' overall development. At the same time, it takes proper implementation for a curriculum to be effective. The use of high-quality pedagogy is critical for efficient curriculum implementation. The successful delivery of curricular material to students depends on employing pedagogical strategies that take into account the varied needs of learners. Scientific assessment methods help students learn better and evaluate how well they can apply their knowledge.

A number of initiatives are required to make sure that learning environments are engaging, supportive, and give all students the opportunity to succeed. The best learning environment encourages the development of capacities like physical fitness, good health, psychosocial wellbeing, and a strong ethical foundation, all of which support high-quality learning.

Focus Area 9: Restructuring of Teacher Education

Convener: Dr. Nalini Patil, Principal, SNDT College of Education, Pune

Policy Goal

As teacher education requires multidisciplinary inputs, and education in high-quality content as well as pedagogy, all teacher education programmes must be conducted within composite multidisciplinary institutions. To this end, all multidisciplinary universities and colleges - will aim to establish education departments which, besides carrying out cutting-edge research in various aspects of education, will also run B.Ed. programmes, in collaboration with other departments such as psychology, philosophy, sociology, neuroscience, Indian languages, arts, music, history, literature, physical education, science and mathematics. All stand-alone TEIs will be required to convert to multidisciplinary institutions by 2030, since they will have to offer the 4-year integrated teacher preparation programme.

Rationale

Education is a social-human process and, therefore, good education requires high-capacity, engaged teachers. For effective implementation of the NEP 2020 at all levels of education, the Teacher Education needs to be strengthened. Teachers must be grounded in Indian values, languages, knowledge, ethos, and traditions including tribal traditions, while also being well-versed in the latest advances in education and pedagogy. This calls for the need of sustained high-quality education and opportunities for hands on training for the student teachers. The teacher education curricula need to be re-imagined, appropriate to the complex and critical role that teachers play, and for high-quality teaching-learning. The multidisciplinary approach of education requires composite and integrated teacher education. The SNDTWU has identified major goals to be implemented in phased manner.
